We seek innovative and productive scholars and talented teachers who will be role models for our students. We are interested in applications from entry-level candidates to professors with considerable experience in the academy.

UC Law SF seeks scholars focused in any area who are able to teach a 1L class and also cover courses in one or more of the following areas as to which we have specific lines to fill: criminal law (2 lines), employment law, health law (2 lines), and international law. One of the criminal law lines is dedicated to someone capable of and interested in teaching the <a href="Criminal Practice Clinic">Criminal Practice Clinic</a>.

Applicants should have a serious interest in UC Law SF and living in the San Francisco Bay Area. We will conduct initial screening interviews (involving presentation of a scholarly work) for select candidates via Zoom and/or on-campus, with a second round of interviews and paper discussion for leading candidates on campus. We will begin considering applications as early as June 20, on a rolling basis.
