



Dan Rosen's first career as a broadcast journalist led to his specializing in media and entertainment law in his next career as a teacher of law. One of his earliest academic articles, on libel and works of fiction, was published in the Comm/Ent journal at UC College of the Law, San Francisco (under its previous name).

Dan earned his J.D. degree at Southern Methodist University, where he was Editor-in-Chief of Southwestern Law Journal (since renamed SMU Law Review). He went on to receive LL.M. and J.S.D. degrees at Yale Law School and to serve as a law clerk to Chief Judge James R. Browning of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

Dan joined the Faculty of Law at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok in 2023, at the start of its innovative LLBel program, which emphasizes technology. Earlier that year, he was named Professor Emeritus at Chuo University in Tokyo, where he had taught since 2004. Prior to that, he was at Doshisha University in Kyoto.

Throughout his academic career, Dan has been involved with a number of media organizations. His talk will focus on entertainment industry issues, as online technology complicates the notion of country-specific regulation.
